Joseph A. Foran High School is one of two high schools in Milford, Connecticut. The Milford community is fairly affluent, and is growing as the number of residents commuting to other locations has increased. As a community in transition, the expectations for education of the district's students have been rising correspondingly.

Those expectations coupled with the needs of the student population lead Foran High School Principal Michael Cummings to support the acquisition of SANAKO Study 1200. "We wanted an ability to facilitate the work, especially in situations where for example, you have 25 students and one teacher," he explained. The school also wanted to have technology that would not replace teachers, but would help them to be more efficient and allow them to more effectively monitor students and their work.

With these considerations in mind the school selected Study 1200 to drive its languages program. For Spanish teacher and Milford District Languages Coordinator Ed Connolly, practice, particularly in oral exercises is important in learning a language. He says Study 1200 allows students to practice with confidence, strengthen their pronunciation, and listen better to help correct errors in speech. "It gave my students the opportunity to use languages. If you have a large class like we have here, how often do they get a chance to use the language? Sanako allows them to talk for a few minutes and it allows me to later on monitor how they are doing."

According to the Spanish teacher, the software is engaging for students, an important factor in effective learning. When students become active participants in learning, they can take on more responsibility in correcting their own weaknesses. "They are much more engaged in front of the computer than otherwise. They all try their best and are engaged at all times. There is no downtime with this. I can have a list of activities on the screen and the students can choose what they need the most. It hones in on areas of weakness that they need to work on," he explained.

She has also developed a preference for certain activities that she feels prepare her for using the language more effectively. "I like when we are given a prompt, like a movie to watch and then are asked 10 things about the movie. It's like sit down and go, because in real life, its fast situations, you don't have time to think of what you say."

District Language Coordinator Ed Connolly sums up the potential of the Study 1200 software best when he points out that Study 1200 makes teachers more effective - preparation, delivery and management of the class take less time, and creates more time for actual teaching. "I can have 28 students do an exercise in 4-5 minutes which before would have taken an entire period, look how much time you can save!"
